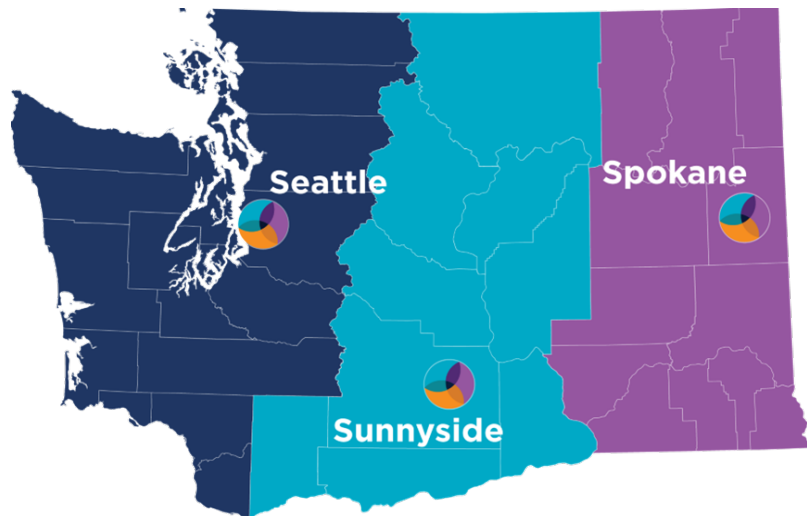

# Community Grants Program Overview

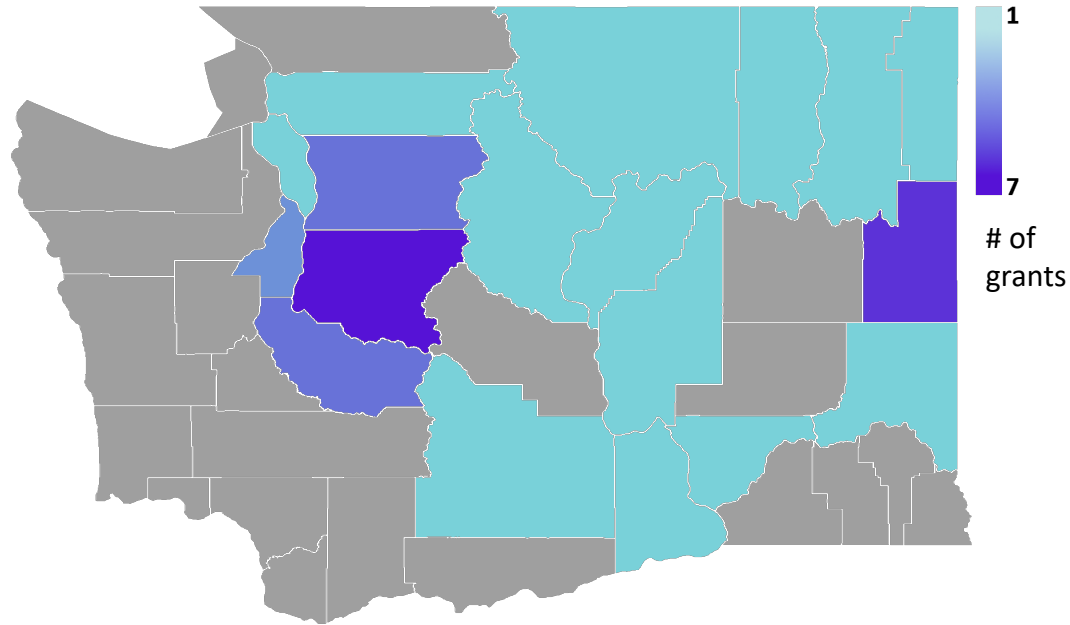
Since 2014, Fred Hutch has offered grant funding to eligible community-based organizations and Tribes in Washington State.

# Cancer Consortium Priority Areas

## Cancer Sites:

Breast cancer, Prostate cancer, Lung cancer, Hematologic malignancies, Colorectal cancer, Leukemia in children ages 0-14, Ovarian cancer in adults 65 and older

- 3) Deliver access to affordable & attainable comprehensive care**

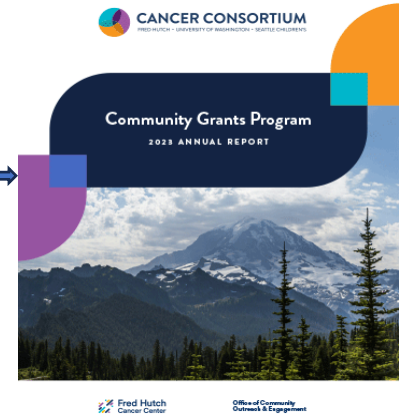
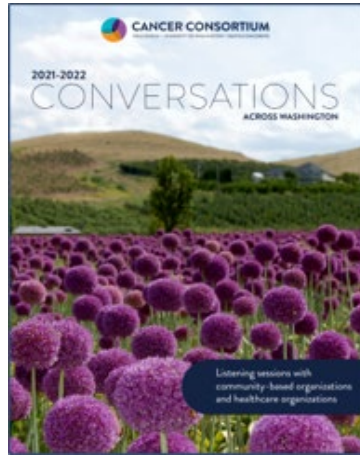
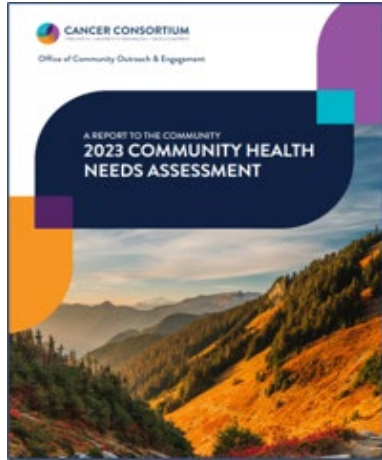

# Eligibility Criteria

- Community-based organizations, non-profit, 501(c)3 organizations, and Tribes located in Washington State.
- Services must be provided in Washington State or serve residents in Washington.
- Applicants should have experience working with/in diverse racial, ethnic and underserved communities.

# Cover Letter

A request for the grant, including the project title, amount requested, and collaborators



# Organization Summary – 1 page

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Let us know who you are, and your organizational capacity related to the grant topic.



# Project Proposal (4 pages max)

- Title & Introduction (1 pg)
- Goal & Objectives ( $\frac{1}{2}$  pg)
- Collaboration ( $\frac{1}{4}$  pg)
- Methods (2 pgs)
- Timeline ( $\frac{1}{4}$  pg)
- References

# Project Proposal – Goal and Objectives

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What is your project goal?

What are the objectives/specific aims that will support the goal?

A project should have **1 goal**, and **no more than 3** objectives.

- Consider who will be responsible for each objective
- Share data on how many in your community may be served by the completion of this project

# Project Proposal – Methods

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## Setting

- Where will the program take place?
- Who will it serve?

## Engagement

- How will you identify and engage people to participate?

## Design

- How will the project be implemented?

## Evaluation

- How will you evaluate your project?

## Project Outcomes

- Measurable, sustainable



# Project Proposal – References

Be sure to cite the sources for any literature you use in your proposal



# Budget

## Allowable costs

- Personnel costs
- Supplies
- Travel
- Additional costs associated with the conduct of the project should be justified.
- Associated costs to be covered by the organization, another grant, or provided in-kind by community partners should be delineated as such.

## Non-allowable costs

- Individual patient care
- Budget deficits or debt reduction
- Core programming
- Contributions to fundraising events/campaigns/drives, etc.
- Political campaigns or lobbying
- New construction or renovations or purchase of land or buildings
- Activities being supported by another grant

# Mentorship

## Cancer Consortium Mentor or OCOE Partner

Benefits of working with a mentor include the following, but are not limited to:

- Forming SMART goal and objectives
- Adapting an evidence-informed/based intervention
- Developing a data-driven evaluation plan
- Community and academic relationship building

# Letters of Support

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Collaborations with external partners should include a Letter of Support (LOS) stating their contribution and commitment to your project.

## **Letters of support should:**

- Be written from the point of view of your partner
- Be printed on partner's institutional letter head and signed by the partner
- Be addressed to the project lead of the proposal or to Fred Hutch Cancer Center

# Who reviews the applications?



All complete applications will be reviewed by a peer review panel consisting of community partners/members and academic partners.

# Review Criteria

## Significance (20%)

- What you wrote in your Introduction and the Goals & Objectives sections.
- Does the program address the needs identified?

## Priority Areas and Populations (10%)

- Does the project demonstrate alignment with at least one of the priority areas identified in the Purpose section?
- Does the project address at least one identified disparity?

## Project Team & Approach (50%)

- What you wrote in your Collaboration and Methods sections.
- Is the project well planned?
- Does the project have documented plan to evaluate program impact?
- Is the budget appropriate and realistic?

## Overall Impact (20%)

- Will the project have an impact on the population selected?
- Does it serve as a pilot to establish knowledge for a larger project or grant?
- Are partnerships likely to be sustained after the project ends?
